Very strong Easterly current. 0856 Begin moving West. Cannot make
headway. 0903 Moving to the SE. Moving quickly with the current.
0919 482m. Reach the SE side of the area 3 circle. 0923 Begin
moving to the NW. 1111 464m near WP#2. 1112 Move to the SW.
1142 467m Locate a wrecked vessel. Conduct survey of vessel
approximately 52m long. Looks like a small Navy tender, WWII vintage.
1227 Move SW. 1248 465m. Locate a large wing with fish. 1308 Move S.
1336 Locate 2 corroded cylinders. May be ordnance. 1402 476m. Reach
WP#4. Begin moving to the NE. 1421 474m. Locate what might be a 1000lb
bomb. 1424 Continue NNE. 1409 Reach NE edge of circle. 1526 461m
 Equipment Deficiencies: on top of a large carbonate outcrop. 1528 Continue to
the West. 1558 455m Leave the bottom.
